On December 4th, Karen Pickard, of the Daily Bread Soup Kitchen came by to tell us about how her or-



ganization helps our community. The Kitchen is open 7 days a week and serves 200 people per day! Most of the people they serve are the "working poor", people who can't provide healthy, nutritious food for their children. They come to the Kitchen so their families will get at least one good meal per day. The Kitchen gets their food from a variety of sources, some restaurants donate leftovers but most they buy from the Eastern Illinois Food Bank where \$10 worth of food can feed 20 people at the Kitchen. They also have a backpack program where they fill new backpacks with necessities like underwear, hand warmers, chap sticks, blankets, etc. Last year they filled and gave away over 800 backpacks!
